THEORIZING NEGLECTED CASES

What happens when we take a closer look at "neglected cases"?

In research, we often focus on certain cases and examples while overlooking others. The most well-known example of this is "eurocentrism" - the tendency to treat European experiences as the standard for everything else. But the issue goes beyond that.

Neglected cases are particularly interesting because they differ from the usual, heavily studied examples. Yet they're also different from mere outliers or exceptional cases. This talk shows how we can gain valuable new insights from such neglected cases.
